

Public Solicitations/Advertising in Schools

The public school system shall cooperate with community organizations helping them forward activities which serve to enrich the experiences of the children. Such cooperation may take the forms outlined below.

1. School Related Organizations

With the approval of the building principal, these organizations may use school bulletin boards, PA systems, and may have the privilege of sending notices home with children regarding their activities (examples: PTA, Book Fair).

2. Youth-Oriented Nonprofit Organizations

With the approval of the building principal, these organizations may use school bulletin boards to disseminate information on applying for membership, activities, schedules and events. Notices which are sent home must carry a disclaimer stating that it is not a school sponsored activity. No solicitations of money or of tickets will be permitted by these groups in the schools; staff members will not be asked to collect application blanks or other forms.

Approved organizations include Town and County Recreation programs, Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts, 4-H, Little League Baseball, Pee Wee Wrestling, Archuleta County Library, and other organizations deemed appropriate by the superintendent.

3. Charity Fund-Raising

Only one charity fund-raising drive a year shall be permitted among students. The administration shall select the appropriate charity each year.

4. Advertising

Unsolicited sales by businesses shall not be allowed during the regular school day. Recruiters from colleges or the armed services shall make arrangements with the building principal prior to visiting the school.
